**“THE ATLANTIC COAST PIPELINE:
HEADING FOR NASH COUNTY”**

The proposed pipeline would deliver 2 billion cubic feet of natural gas for 592 miles through a 42-inch pipeline from West Virginia through Virginia and a 36-inch pipeline in North Carolina. It would cut through the properties of more than 160 Nash County property owners.

What are the concerns of these owners and area residents?

What are the environmental concerns?

How safe have these pipelines proven to be in other localities?

What is the risk versus benefit?

How might it help our local economy and attract new industries?
